


memories on or near the water.

#### **Summer Rendezvous Friends**

Squadron Member Assists Toronto Sailing Couple during July 4th Weekend At Squalicum Harbor.

From the log of Aubrey and Judy Millard on "Veleda IV"

...We returned to Squalicum Harbour next day, July 4, U.S. Independence Day to go alongside our usual transient "T" dock at Gate 12. However as I was slowly motoring inside the harbour ready to make a 180 degree turn to go alongside, I wanted to put the engine in neutral to coast over to the dock, but I couldn't take the engine out of forward gear! The engine was stuck in gear and I couldn't go into neutral or reverse. The gearshift cable was seized up. Lots of fun! I could throttle down but not stop the forward thrust of the propeller. The light breeze was blowing astern of us but towards the dock. I altered the 180 degrees to starboard to line up parallel to the dock, reduced the revs as much as possible, then shut the engine off to glide in dead slow, and drift to a stop alongside, well before the next boat forward of us.

The Skagit Power Squadron had the whole dock reserved for their club, but only two boats were alongside at the time, and their crews helped move Veleda closer to make room for the other expected boats. They welcomed us to join their rendezvous cocktail hour and pot luck supper on the dock. Very hospitable of them. Barb and Dan left early afternoon as Dan was driving my Yukon back to store at their place on Vancouver Island.

Meanwhile we had to assess the seized up gearshift cable. As usual, nothing is ever simple! To access the gearshift we had to take the compass off the binnacle, complicated by the fact it wouldn't come off without serious damage. However I was able to loosen up a few bolts to swing the compass over allowing access to the cable lever. Down in the engine compartment was another problem. This meant we had to empty out the entire port cockpit locker. Fortunately Mike, a power squadron member came over and offered his help, which was greatly appreciated. He crawled into the port cockpit locker to access the coupling and after much finagling at the engine and binnacle couplings, we extracted the cable, crimped and melted where it came close to the muffler.

Next day we walked the damaged cable the 500 metres over to Reddens, an excellent chandlery beside the marina, and were pleasantly surprised when they had a cable the exact size to replace our damaged one. Mike came and helped us install it. We left at 1345, after hosting several of the Skagit Power Squadron who were interested in Veleda and came over to see us off. Many thanks to their squadron, and particularly to Mike on Mystic, for their assistance and hospitality.
