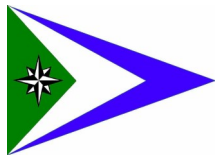

Commander's Message **Kelly Libby, S**

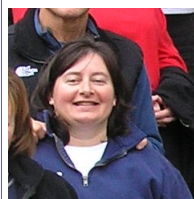
Here's to springtime weather and a new bridge of officers coming soon!

I'm so looking forward to the Change of Watch this coming Thursday and most especially in helping to support Kari Randall-Secret as our new Commander!



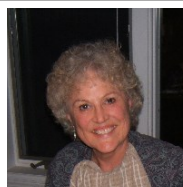
Commander Elect **Kari Randall-Secret, N**

Switching gears just a bit, I'd like to say a few words about the recent Oso Landslide that has so devastatingly impacted our Northwest Washington community. It was my honor and privilege to serve as a member of the Northwest Washington Incident Management Team (NWIMT) alongside so many dedicated and hard-working people for the first 8 days of this tragedy. It was the early afternoon of Saturday, March 22nd when I received "the call". Our team is always packed and ready to go at a moment's notice to respond to local disasters and emergency incidents and the Oso Landslide certainly fit the bill. I am a GIS Specialist for the NWIMT, which means I'm responsible for producing any and all maps that our team might need to conduct operations during an incident. My co-worker Sean Carson and I were both deployed for this incident, and it was a good thing because it took both of us to keep up with the team's mapping demands for such a challenging scene. We produced search grid maps for search and rescue crews, press briefing maps, and collected and mapped GPS tracks and points as searchers and K-9 teams attempted to wade through the muck and rubble that this slide left behind, first looking to rescue survivors and then eventually switching into an even more saddened recovery mode. We worked 28 hours non-stop, as did most members of our team, from the moment we got there and as usual with these kinds of events, we continued putting in long hours during the following 7 days until a relief team took over on Saturday, March 29th. As awful a tragedy as this slide is, I can only say that the resilience and perseverance that the communities of Oso, Darrington, and Arlington demonstrated was, and still is, truly incredible and inspiring to me. The phrase "Oso Strong" that we've all seen so much in regards to this terrible disaster, seems to me, to say it all.

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The Education Department is evaluating the need for our squadron to begin offering the On-The-Water programs offered by National and District 16. Current consensus is that there has been insufficient interest in our squadron to justify the work to organize and manage the program. Our best approach might be to continue sending to Bellingham any people actually wanting to complete the program. The first attempt to set-up the program in our own squadron resulted in no takers except for the certifier. We will not run out of people who think that somebody else should go to the work of setting up a program, creating and maintaining certifiers, identifying and recruiting students, and scheduling and delivering the course. National's OTW program has been expanded to include advanced courses. Perhaps this will generate more interest. We'll see.

Skagit Bay and Friday Harbor Joint Rendezvous in Sidney, BC **11-13 April 2014**

Where: Port of Sidney Marina, BC, <http://www.portsidney.com/>, 48° 39' N, 123° 24' W, VHF CH 66A

Come on over to Vancouver Island, BC, and join Bob and Jean Miller (and Bodhi, the orange tabby boat cat) as we visit nearby Sidney on (with luck) a nice Spring weekend. The host boat will be the *Loon Song*. This will be a great chance for members of the Skagit Bay and Friday Harbor squadrons to check out their boats in preparation for Spring cruising.

The Town of Sidney (sometimes called Sidney-by-the-Sea or the 'Book Store Village' is a great place to spend the weekend, with plenty of good restaurants, nice galleries, and lots of chocolate shops! Bob always says "Chocolate is one of the basic food groups." The Port Sidney Marina features wide concrete docks, lots of space (at least early in the season), and is located at the base of the main shopping street. Winter rates are still in effect. We may use the Party Dock for a Saturday afternoon 'meet and greet' (if it doesn't get sold before then).

SBSPPS Planned Activities: Not many; this is a way kicked-back rendezvous. Just wander along the streets and waterfront, get some exercise, do some shopping, eat some stuff, and take it easy. On Saturday night we will go to a restaurant, which will be chosen by the rendezvous attendees.

How to Get There --

By Boat: Sidney is about 35 nautical miles from Cap Sante in Anacortes and less than 20 miles from Friday Harbor. If leaving from Anacortes, turn left out of Fidalgo Bay into Guemes Channel and just head west. You may have to dodge some islands and large white and green ferry boats, but the cruise is protected and scenic. Look for the orca pods and other wild life. Upon arriving at the entrance to the channel to the marina, hail Port Sidney Marina on VHF Ch 66A, to get docking directions after you clear Canadian customs inside.

By Ferry: The Anacortes-Sidney Washington State ferry leaves Anacortes at 08:30 am and arrives in Sidney by 11:10 am, with a stop in Friday Harbor (departs Friday Harbor at 09:55 am). On Sunday, catch the 12:05 pm ferry to arrive back in Friday Harbor at 1:20 pm and Anacortes by 3:00 pm.

Lodging in Sidney: There are several hotels within walking distance of the ferry terminal and the marina. <http://www.sidneybritishcolumbia.com/Accommodation/results.asp?region=20&city=43&interest=all&webregionid=1>

Passports and Border Control: US Passports are required to get back into the USA and facilitate entry into Canada. Standard Drivers Licenses are not adequate identification. Ferry riders are checked as they exit in Sidney, and in Friday Harbor. Boaters tie up to the customs dock in the turning basin at the marina and use the direct line phone on the dock for clearance. Returning to the USA, boaters can phone US Customs and Border Protection while underway at 800-562-5943.

Reservations for Your Boat: Please make your own reservation at Port of Sidney Marina on their website at <http://www.portsidney.com/contact-us/reservations/> or phone the office at 250-655-3711. Also send an email to the cruise coordinator (see next section).

To Signup: Send an email to Bob Miller, Skagit Bay SPS, bobmillerwa@hotmail.com, listing the names of the people attending the rendezvous, the date of arrival, mode of arrival (boat, ferry), and the boat name if coming by boat. If on a boat, also include the LOA, beam, and power requirements (30 or 50 amps), and your docking preference (bow or stern in, port or starboard tie).
