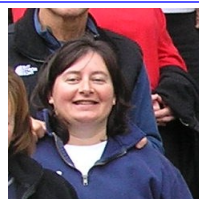

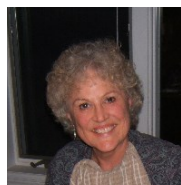
Electives -

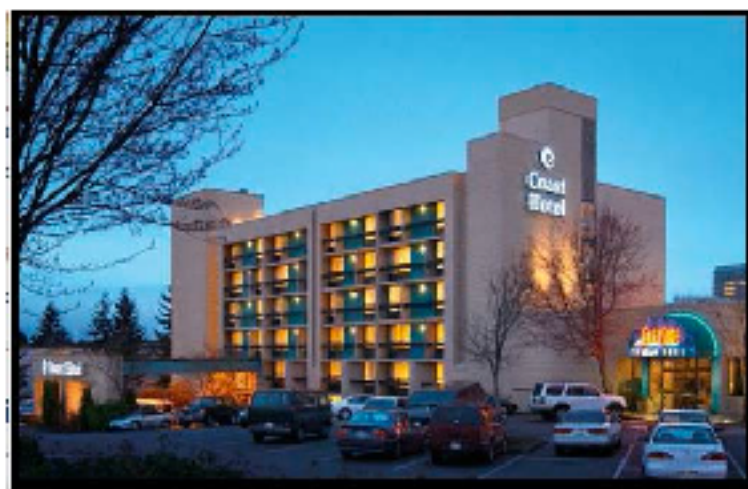
