Don't forget that there has been a recent recall of some specific models of Kidde fire extinguishers. These extinguishers are ADC-rated disposable models manufactured between July 23, 2013 and October 15, 2014. For more details on the specific models involved, go to Kidde.com.

### **From the Galley...**

### **Dale Libby 's World Renown Chicken Avocado Burritos**

#### **Ingredients:**

2 cups cooked and shredded chicken (or 2 chicken breasts, salt and pepper to taste, 1 Tablespoon mustard, 1 Tablespoon olive oil)

1 Avocado

2 Tablespoon cilantro - chopped

4 Large tortillas

1 Tablespoon vegetable oil

1 cup grated cheese (I use mozzarella)

4 Tablespoons sour cream

### **Directions:**

Heat 1 tablespoon olive oil in a frying pan, place chicken breast sprinkled with salt and pepper and roast for about 5 minutes on each side. Spread 1 tablespoon mustard over the chicken, add about ¼ cup water and cook covered for a few more minutes.

Cut cooked chicken into thin stings.

Mix the chicken, cheese, cilantro, and the diced avocados.

Spread 1 tablespoon sour cream on each tortilla, add ¼ of the mixture, and form a roll.

Heat 1 tablespoon oil into a pan and place all four tortillas on the pan, cook for 2 minutes on medium-high heat. Flip on the other side and cook for another 2 minutes or until the tortillas are golden.

*Note: Watch closely so the tortillas don't burn.*

Serve warm

*Note: Good dipping sauce is Thousand Island dressing !*

Have you ever wondered what a chart number is or which chart is needed for an area? Well NOAA has in interactive chart catalog online: <http://www.nauticalcharts.noaa.gov/pdfcharts/> . When you click on the chart catalog, you will a map of North America. So if you need a chart for Key West, you can get the number from here! Enlarge the area you are searching in, and then click inside the box. On the right hand side, you will see the chart number with printing and viewing options. You can view the chart on-line, download it as a .pdf (you will need Adobe Acrobat to view), get the latest Notice to Mariners for that chart or buy it at a Print on Demand vendor. Now you should always have the correct chart for the area you're boating in!

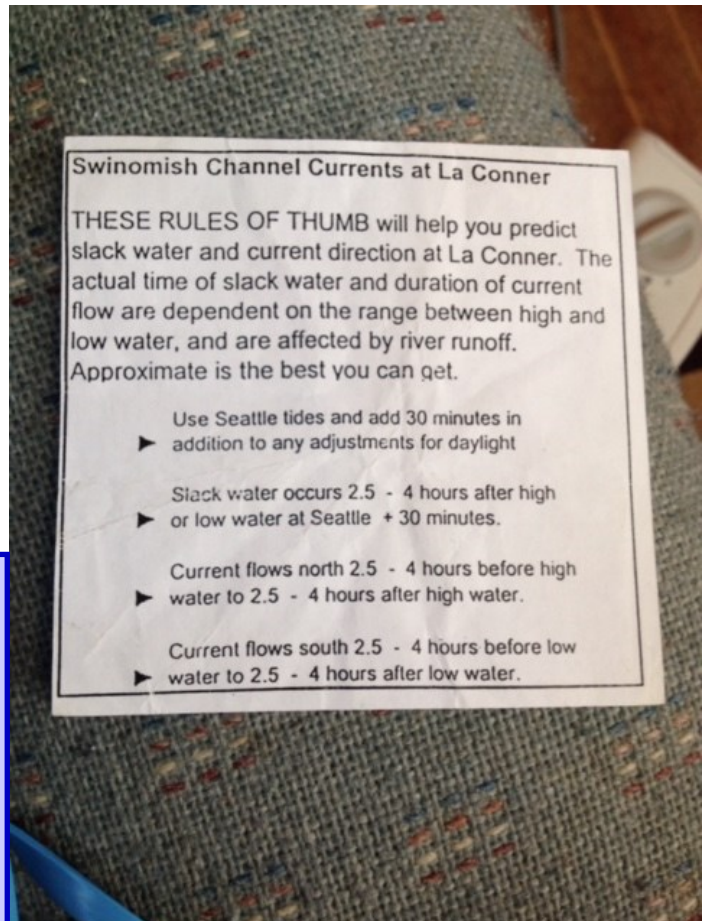

## Plug your coconut phone into the palm tree, so you can tell everybody...

**Docking:** Who's better trained than Tacoma Squadron to fit 50+ squadron boats into a small town marina? Record shows nobody! Therefore arriving boats are required to call in on VHF 72, prior to entering the marina. Even if you do not wish assistance in docking, please inform the docking crew you have arrived for your slip assignment. Viking Law!!!

**Registration:** Friday and Saturday, rendezvous check-in will be at the Multi-Purpose Room (MPR) located at the entrance to "E" dock. Times for registration will be posted on front of the building. You must send in the \$5.00 dock reservation fee (non-refundable) with your reservation to ensure you will have a confirmed slip. The remainder of your moorage fees (for your entire stay), must be paid directly to the Port of Poulsbo (not to District 16). The reservation for your meals and moorage must be received (yes to District 16) by 12 June 2015. No guarantees for the dinner or dock space after this date. Receive your "Passport to Fun" upon registration. Have your passport stamped as you travel to "Around the World" themed hors d'oeuvres stations, Breakouts, Training Events and Seminars. Prizes will be awarded to the most well-traveled passport holders.

**Boat Operator Certifier Qualification:** BOC qualification and training will be available for both Inland and Coastal Navigator. Sign up now as space is limited.

**Inland and Coastal Navigator:** Inland and Coastal certifiers will be available on Wednesday, 24 June thru Friday, 26 June, to witness power boat handling skill demonstrations and sign off on passports for this level. This training will be similar to last year's program. It takes about three to four hours to complete the training. If you want to receive credit for either Inland or Coastal Navigator, you need to obtain an Inland or Coastal Navigator Candidate Kit (Passport) by ordering through your SEO, prior to the class, then email or call Bob Anderson. His email & phone #s are found below.

**Advanced Coastal Navigator:** This class will be offered on Thursday, 25 June, starting at 4 PM; leaving the dock at 8 PM and returning at 12:00 AM.

**Note:** There will not be training for members on Saturday.
