
hope you all have an especially happy and safe Thanksgiving holiday!

Nov. 12th Program Summary Hiking Alaska's Chilkoot Trail: A Family Adventure

In the summer of 2014, two power boaters, along with some brave family members, temporarily traded in their twin props for hiking boots and trekking poles in order to follow in the footsteps of gold miners and hike Alaska's famous 33-mile Chilkoot Trail. Come and see our slideshow presentation which includes a bit of Klondike Gold Rush and Chilkoot Trail history, our ferry-boat trip from Juneau to Skagway on the Alaska Marine Highway, a bit of trekking on the Mendenhall Glacier, that hike over Chilkoot Pass, and finally our experience with the rite of passage known as the "Sourtoe Cocktail" which we consumed during our visit to the Klondike gold rush boomtown of Dawson City, Yukon Territory, Canada. Annual meeting is in Orlando next year 15-21 Feb.


D16 has a Facebook page. Check it out.
