

Skagit Bay, Friday Harbor, and Deception Pass Joint Rendezvous in Sidney, BC 22-24 April 2016

Hosts: Bob and Jean Miller, bobmillerwa@hotmail.com, 360-588-9950 (home), 360-540-1686 (boat)

Where: Port of Sidney Marina, BC, http://www.portsidney.com/, 48° 39' N, 123° 24'W, VHF CH 66A Head over to Vancouver Island, BC, and join Bob and Jean Miller and the rest of the Skagit Bay SPS cruisers as we visit nearby Sidney on (with luck) a nice Spring weekend. The host boat will be the Loon Song. This will be a great chance for members of the Skagit Bay, Friday Harbor, and Deception Pass squadrons to check out their boats in preparation for Spring cruising.

The Town of Sidney (sometimes called Sidney-by-the-Sea or the 'Book Store Village') is a great place to spend the weekend, with plenty of good restaurants, nice galleries, and lots of chocolate and tea shops! Bob always says "Chocolate is one of the basic food groups."

The Port Sidney Marina features wide concrete docks, lots of space (at least early in the season), and is located at the base of the main shopping street, Beacon Avenue. Winter rates are still in effect. We may use the Party Dock for a Saturday afternoon 'meet and greet'.

Planned Activities: Not many; this is a way kicked-back rendezvous. Just wander along the streets and waterfront, get some exercise, do some shopping, eat some stuff, and take it easy. On Saturday night we will go to a restaurant, which will be chosen by the rendezvous attendees. Perhaps some of your fellow boaters can come up with some group activities for the days. For those arriving on Friday, Jean and I will host an informal meet and greet onboard *Loon Song*, bring your own drink and a snack to share.

How to Get There --

By Boat: Sidney is about 35 nautical miles from Cap Sante in Anacortes and less than 20 miles from Friday Harbor. If leaving from Anacortes, turn left out of Padilla Bay into Guemes Channel and just head west. You may have to dodge some islands and large white and green ferry boats, but the cruise is protected and scenic. Look for the orca pods and other wild life. Upon arriving at the entrance to the channel to the marina, hail Port Sidney Marina on VHF Ch 66A to get docking directions after you clear Canadian customs inside.

By Ferry: The Anacortes-Sidney Washington State ferry leaves Anacortes at 08:30 am and arrives in Sidney by 11:10 am, with a stop in Friday Harbor (departs Friday Harbor at 09:55 am). On Sunday, catch the 12:05 pm ferry to arrive back in Friday Harbor at 1:20 pm and Anacortes by 3:00 pm.

Lodging in Sidney: For those coming by ferry, there are several hotels within walking distance of the ferry terminal and the marina. http://www.ehcanadatravel.com/british-columbia/vancouver-island/sidney.html

Passports and Border Control: US Passports are required to get back into the USA and facilitate entry into Canada. Standard WA Drivers Licenses are not adequate identification. Ferry riders are checked as they exit in Sidney, and in Friday Harbor. Boaters tie up to the customs dock in the turning basin at the marina and use the direct line phone on the dock for clearance. Returning to the USA, boaters can phone US Customs and Border Protection while underway at 800-562-5943.

Reservations for Your Boat: Please make your own reservation at Port of Sidney Marina on their website at http://portsidney.com/port-sidney-marina-reservations/ or phone the office at 250-655-3711. Make sure to mention that this is for the Skagit Bay Power Squadron group rendezvous. Also send an email to the cruise coordinator (see next section). **The marina requires reservations be made at least a month before the event.**

To Signup: Send an email to Bob Miller, Skagit Bay SPS, bobmillerwa@hotmail.com, listing the names of the people attending the rendezvous, the date of arrival, mode of arrival (boat, ferry), and the boat name if coming by boat. If on a boat, also include the LOA, beam, and power requirements (30 or 50 amps), and your docking preference (bow or stern in, port or starboard tie).

WASHINGTON – STRAIT OF JUAN DE FUCA TO STRAIT OF GEORGIA – SWINOMISH CHANNEL– Swinomish Channel South Entrance Range Front Light reduction in dayboard size

The U.S. Coast Guard will be reducing the dayboard size of Swinomish Channel South Entrance Range Front Light (LLNR 18820) from a 8KRW (8' wide by 16' tall red dayboard with a white vertical stripe) to a 6KRW (6' wide by 12' tall red dayboard with a white vertical stripe). Tidal and wave action has destroyed the current 8KRW dayboard, and the 6KRW will be installed as a temporary measure until its effectiveness can be determined. The U.S. Coast Guard is soliciting comments on this change, which may be submitted to email address d13-PF-LNM@uscq.mil or (206) 220-7276.

There is a change to the Shag Rock Daybeacon in Harney Channel. It is changing to a WB Bn – White and Blue Beacon (currently a white beacon)
