Secretary's Report by Sharon Knowles: Minutes of January meeting were published in the Bitter End. Correction of the spelling of Kelly Libby's name. Motion to approve the corrected minutes was made by Debbie Richey, seconded by Kelly Libby. Approved.

Treasurer's Report by Bob Miller: The balance on February 2, 2016 was \$5,679.22. The income was \$596.91 from the ABC class and \$96.50 from new memberships. The outgo of \$180 was for ABC instructor manuals, dues forwarded to National, etc. Bob will consider suggestions from membership regarding a simple bookkeeping system, capable of producing annual budgets and tracking details.

Administrative Report by Deanna Randall-Secrest: Tonight's program was given by Mr. Nir Barnea from NOAA, about "Marine Debris." In March, Kris & Becky Burton will present their 10-Year Family Adventure aboard "Wandering Dolphin."

Donna Mason gave her Activities Report in which details of the February and March rendezvous were presented and discussed.

Executive Report by Mark Richey: Debbie Richey reported that Safe Boating Week is coming up in May, and asked for suggestions for a squadron activity. Kelly Libby said that the Anacortes Spring Boat Show is going to be April 8 - 10th, and perhaps something could be tied in with Safe Boating Week.

Education Report by Debbie Richey: Debbie presented Sheryl & Mike Wytychak with Educational Proficiency Awards earned by achieving a grade level of at least Advanced Piloting (AP) and completing at least three Elective Courses. Congratulations to you both! In Mike's ABC Class, he recently incorporated "Knot Stations" into his curriculum, in order to teach the tying of various knots. He thanked George Johnson and George Brooks for all the background assistance they provide so that all he has to do is "walk in and teach the class." Thanks, gentlemen!

Commander's Report by Kari Randall-Secrest: Kari said that the National Meeting will be February 14-21 in Orlando, FL and our delegate vote is available, should anyone intend to go. D16 Spring Council/Conference is March 18-20 in Tacoma, and the delegate vote is available for that as well. There will again be a Spring Photo Contest in D16. Deadline for entries is February 29th. Squadron shirt orders for 2016 are to be submitted to Sheryl Wytychak. The proposed 2016 Bridge has been submitted, with the vote to be held at the March meeting. Thanks to all those taking positions next year! Debbie Richey volunteered to run the March meeting, in the absence of our Commander. The increase in dues was outlined by Cheryl West, D16 Treasurer, with the increase taking effect on December 1, 2015. National dues for Single is \$51, an increase of \$4. National Family is \$76.50, an increase of \$6. Life Member with Family is \$25.50, an increase of \$2. (Life Member without Family is still free, according to Debbie Richey.)

Old Business: A survey was sent to membership concerning the Squadron fund-raiser idea. Ninety-four percent responded "not to replace Shipwreck Day" with the Coffee Program at a Rest Area. A motion was made by Debbie Richey to reject the Rest Area fund-raiser. Seconded by Lynn Stewart. Motion approved. Thanks to Albert Miller for all the leg-work he provided in gathering information! George Johnson asked for approval for the \$160 entry fee for Shipwreck Day. A motion to approve this expenditure was made by Debbie Richey, and seconded by Donna Mason. Motion carried.
