La Conner Marina Rendezvous: 13-15 May

Join hosts Kari and Deanna for our squadron's first La Conner Marina Rendezvous, May 13-15. Travel by car or boat - your choice!

Marina Information

The La Conner Marina is located at 613 North 2nd Street in La Conner and is split into 2 parts, a north basin and south basin. We will be tying up at the visitor's dock located in the south basin from which you can easily walk and shop the town's waterfront.

Arrival & Moorage

Your hosts are planning to arrive at the "F" visitor dock by 1:00 pm on Friday May 13th, which is check-in time. The moorage rate is \$1.00/ft/ day and 30-amp power is included. To reserve a slip, you'll need to call the marina at 360-466-3118 or make your reservation online by following the links at the bottom of their quest moor-<u>age reservations page</u>. Please note the first night is required when you make your reservation and is non-refundable. When you make your reservation, be sure to let the marina know that you're with Skagit Bay Sail & Power Squadron. We have 5 remaining slips penciled in for our group, but you'll need to make your reservation soon, or we'll lose them as the date approaches.

If you've never <u>navigated the Swinomish Channel</u>, no need to worry ... simply keep in mind that when docking, you'll want to be headed against the current. The current in the channel flows north when going to a high tide and flows to the south when going to a low tide. The best time to arrive at the marina is at slack which is typically 2.5 to 4 hours before or after high or low tide.

*One tip we might add: If you are unsure which direction the current is flowing when you arrive, take a look at the front of the nearby La Conner fuel dock building because they have a sign

with a red arrow indicating the direction the current is flowing at the moment.

Schedule

Our schedule is light at this rendezvous, so you'll have plenty of time to relax and explore beautiful La Conner. Join us for a light happy hour on the dock at 4:30 pm Friday afternoon and then dinner at the La Conner Brewery at 6:00 pm.

Saturday evening, we'll enjoy a potluck dinner back on our dock at 6:00 pm. Bring your favorite dish to share, and your beverage of choice.

Sunday means it's time to head back to our home ports, check-out time is 12 noon.

Please let us know if you plan on attending, either by boat or car, so we can get a head count for the restaurant reservation on Friday and/or the potluck on Saturday. Sure hope you can join us for our first ever rendezvous in lovely La Conner!

SHIPWRECK DAY 2016 P/C George Johnson, SN

Shipwreck Day in Anacortes this year is <u>July 16.</u> We start by asking friends, relatives and neighbors if they might have something to donate to our non-profit USPS. The donation is tax deductible, and our EIN # is 43-1971183. We even have

a "Donation Request" form, and occasionally a business or individual might want it . So far, that's been 3 times in our first 14 years of doing Shipwreck Day. (George Johnson will email that form to those who ask). If necessary, George can coordinate pick-up and delivery to the squadron. This year our storage unit is almost full, so we will ask people to hold on to stuff until July, if convenient. We have a 40 ft. booth, two sides, so we have 80 ft. of table space.

In early July we have a "pricing day". You might want to help with that. Several of us meet at the storage unit in West Burlington in the afternoon and price our goods. It's fun, takes about an hour or two, and then we go to dinner at a local inexpensive restaurant.

On the Friday before Shipwreck Day a few of us with trucks or big SUV's meet at the storage unit and load up. Be careful about volunteering for that because it means you have to arrive on the street at our booth site by 5:30 a.m. the next morning. (It's OK if one vehicle can't arrive early. We just add their load to our sales tables whenever they can get there. Not a biggie.)

On the big day those with our stuff arrive at our booth site between 5:15 and 5:30 a.m. to set things up. Bring your own donuts and coffee. We have 8 tables, two canopies and other booth equipment, plus all the goods.

Sales start as soon as anybody wants to buy something, often as we unload, but official sales hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.. We must have everything off of the street by 5:00 p.m. (and the City really means 5:00 p.m.). A few of us will again load our trucks/SUV's with the leftovers. Some will go back to our storage unit, and some will go to Goodwill or equivalent, or to "other places". At 5:00 p.m. we walk to dinner in town at some inexpensive restaurant.

We always have 15 or more members, not all at once, who help with the selling at some point during the day. Everybody takes time to walk the street looking for more stuff they don't really need.

It's a super day, one of our best social events of the year.

This will be our 14th year at Shipwreck Day. It's been our primary fundraiser.

As you can see, there are plenty of things to do, and we welcome everyone's involvement.

Annual District 16 Rendezvous

Port of Poulsbo 24-26 June 2016

Docking: The Tacoma Squadron's Docking Specialists will be assisting in assigning docking spots, arrival of boats and docking. Please call in on VHF 72, prior to entering the marina. Even if you do not wish assistance in docking, please inform the docking crew of your arrival.

Registration: Friday and Saturday, rendezvous check-in will be at the Multi-Purpose Room (MPR) located at the entrance to "E dock". Times for registration will be posted on front of the building. You must send in the non-refundable \$5.00 dock reservation fee with your reservation to ensure you will have a confirmed slip. The remainder of your moorage fees (for your entire stay), must be paid directly to the Port of Poulsbo, i.e. not to District 16. Please check in on VHF 72 when your boat arrives at the marina. The reservation for your meals and moorage must be received by 10 June 2016. No guarantees for the dinner or dock space after this date.

Friday Evening Social: The Docktail Party is from 1700-1900 on "E Dock". Please bring hors d'oevres from your squadron's favorite regional American Cuisine. Boatersbring tables to set up on the finger docks between boats. All alcoholic beverages must remain within the docks and cannot pass the ramp. The best American Region themed serving station décor, food taste and variety winners will be honored with trophies and bragging rights.

Saturday Morning's Opening Ceremony: It will begin at 1000 Sharp on the outside grass area which is directly at the rear of the Sons of Norway Hall's area. The SS Hurricane Sea Scouts will serve as the honor guard to present the colors, followed by the invocation.

Fire Extinguisher and Flare Practice: A fire extinguisher practice session is planned for Saturday morning between 1030 and 1200 at the adjacent park's fire pit.
