I especially want to thank George and Sandy Johnson who orchestrated this big event and made it their project this year.

I'd like to thank the Audit Committee members Elisabeth Libby and Judy Bennett for completing the audit of squadron accounts with Treasurer Bob Miller in a timely manner. We're a small squadron and we don't try to conquer the world and win all the awards. But, what we do, we do well. Thanks for all you do!

If you are looking for a book to read, you may be interested in <u>Before the Wind</u> by Jim Lynch. Having written many books, Jim finally wrote about his passion for sailing through the experience of the Johannssen family of boat designers, builders, repairers, and racers. According to a Village Books reviewer, Lynch "melds sailing with science, environmentalism, the rapture, online dating and endearingly dysfunctional family dynamics into a touching story." "Jim Lynch does for sailing what <u>A River Runs Through It</u> did for fly-fishing," according to Luis Alberto Ürrea.

Ferndale residents Tom Broselle and his sons Jake and Tom recently received one of the Coast Guard's highest honors for their rescue. While they were out crabbing weather conditions worsened and they spotted a 5-member family whose boat capsized in rough water off Cherry Point. Four people were clinging to the overturned boat. Tom dove into the 50 degree water and saved the fifth person, a daughter tangled in netting under the boat. The rescued father said, "When I saw Tom coming in the boat, it was like the Queen Mary was saving us." (From The Bellingham Herald, July 6, 2016)

The USCG's 2015 Recreational Boating Safety statistics report there were 4,158 accidents involving 626 deaths, 2,613 injuries and about \$42 million of property damage. The fatality rate was 1.9% up from 2014. Think some folks need boating education?

Speaking of boating education, we're looking for members to help with instructing. Please consider it and contact Debbie Richie, our Educational Officer with questions or more information. # **Education Department** Lt/C Debbie Richey, AP

I hope you all had a great summer out on your boat. I know we did. I saw some things this summer that made my hair curl even more! This incident happened as everyone was leaving Deer Harbor on Sunday morning: This morning as I sit here in the Deer Harbor Marina, I've watched way too many close calls of folks leaving their slip. A word of advice, when leaving

your slip look and make sure no one else is coming down the fairway behind you. One of our members was leaving his slip and THREE boats all decided that they needed to back out of their slip at the same time as he is backing down the fairway. All of the boats were over 35 feet. Don't forget your horn signals when leaving your slip. We all learn the horn signals in the ABC course. For a refresher one long blast lets other boaters know you are leaving your slip or dock.

At the Sucia Island rendezvous, there were only two boats Briongloid and ourselves. Briongloid arrived on Friday afternoon about an hour ahead of us. The Fossil Bay docks were absolutely full! All the mooring buoys in Fossil Bay were also taken. So they tied up to the linear moorage in Echo Bay. There was a spot for us when we arrived about an hour later. We have looked at that tie up before and for us if the line with the

rings in it is too high, we can't moor there. But at this particular one in Echo Bay we were able to tie up. It was interesting. Saturday afternoon the wind came up at tide change and all the boats were rocking really well. But after about an hour or so, it calmed down. For the most part, it's just like being tied to a dock. You definitely want to use fenders even though there are Styrofoam floats on the line. They squeak something awful when rubbing on your hull. As you can see in the picture below, you tie up to the rings with a bow line and stern line. You cannot raft off while tied up here. There are two of these systems in Echo Bay and I know of one in Reid Harbor. Try it!
