He and his dog were rescued by the USCG after his anchored 38' fiberglass sailboat in Bellingham Bay began drifting. With 3-5' waves and 20 mph winds, he couldn't prevent the boat from crashing into a rocky seawall of an abandoned pier along the shoreline. Sailor Jody Winningham was baffled about how the anchor could have come loose—he suspects it was hit by a log and loosened. The irony here is he is the one who has been reminding other sailors to take extra precautions with their anchors.






