

WASHINGTON - STRAIT OF JUAN DE FUCA TO STRAIT OF GEORGIA – GUEMES CHANNEL – Request for reduced wake near drydocks.

Mariners at Lovric's Sea Craft Inc. in Anacortes, WA have requested that vessels reduce their wake to a minimum when transiting in the vicinity when a vessel is within its drydock. The drydocks are in approximate position 48-30-42N 122-38-44W, near the west entrance to Guemes Channel.

WASHINGTON - STRAIT OF JUAN DE FUCA TO STRAIT OF GEORGIA – PADILLA BAY – New Bridge – Availability of Public Notice

All interested parties are notified that the Commander, Thirteenth Coast Guard District has received an application from the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway Company (BNSF), requesting approval of location and plans for the modification of a bridge over a navigablewaterway of the United States. Waterway & Location: Padilla Bay, mile 0.0, along the southern edge near Anacortes, Washington, approximate: Latitude: 48-27-41.4N, Longitude: 122-31-22.7W. Character of Work: BNSF proposes to replace the existing, single track timber bridge, which has reached its structural life expectancy with a new steel and concrete bridge comprised of a pre-stressed concrete double cell box resting on six bents made of precast concrete caps and 4 steel H-piles, each. The new bridge will be approximately 140 feet. For more information, including instructions on providing comments:

We'll have finished the Saturday, March 4 - Tacoma Train Day Trip by the time you receive this letter. We had a small, but quality group.



# **March Program:**

Come to the dinner meeting on March 9 at the Farmhouse Restaurant and see some of the sights of the Miller's travels to India and Bhutan. They have spent seven weeks over two trips visiting the big cities, rural countryside, and the far reaches of bird sanctuaries in the interior. In 2010, their first trip covered the west coast of India from Mumbai to the Taj Mahal and the River Ganges and then hopscotched down the coast through Goa and to the spicy rice-based dishes in Kerala. The second trip in 2016 started in the south-east corner of Mysore and covered the eastern coast up to Kolkata and made a detour into the high tea plantations of Darjeeling. They finished off the trip with a five-day excursion to the Buddhist country of Bhutan, before returning via Delhi. Prior to these pleasure trips, Bob made several extended business trips to India in the mid-1990s.
