Saturday, September 30, is the Squadron's Anniversary Cookout at Washington State Park's Coronet Bay near Deception Pass. Paul and I cannot attend and P/C Kari and Deanna Randall-Secrest stepped up to host this event. September 30 is one of the State Parks "free" day use days where you do not have to have a Discover Pass for parking. VE Notes - September

Program consistency and Credibility: It happens just about every boating season. I will be unable to issue a VSC sticker for some infraction only to be informed the boat had passed the previous year(s) with the infraction as I found it. Usually, such infractions fall into that category I previously mentioned "not so easy to fix". Makes for an unhappy, and often skeptical, vessel owner who

might turn doubtful of the examiners qualifications and question program credibility.

This was another beautiful vessel I had the privilege to board. It was shipshape in every way, except for how the official document number was displayed. The owner, who clearly had pride in his vessel, had a professionally manufactured number placard simply screwed to a cabinet in the helm area. Clearly not permanently attached in such a way removal or replacement would be obvious. The problem was this boat had been issued a VSC sticker last year and years prior. Therein lays the issue. Inconsistent application of VSC program guidance and federal and state regulations. This problem will not be going away anytime soon but I do think it's getting better. The new Vessel Safety Check Manual (2014) is much improved from past reference materials, provides VE's with detail guidance, and will help minimize inconsistencies and improve credibility. So that being said.....

More VE's needed: Our Squadron could use a few more examiners. There are plenty of opportunities for participation in various events, especially early in the boating season. Once qualified, you need do only five inspections annually to maintain currency. It's a good way to see some great boats of all makes and vintage, meet some very nice people, and even learn something along the way. Fall and winter is a great time to get started so if you might be interested please contact me. I'm more than willing to help. If you would like to preview the VE Manual before making a decision to become qualified, it can be found on the USPS Website. Find VSC at the site index.

Join us for an after-cruising-season excursion. I urge you to make your train and hotel reservations sooner than later for the best rates and availability.

Amtrak Make your reservation via www.Amtrak.com or with "Julie" at 800-872-7245. Discounts for AAA members and seniors. Buy your ticket online or with photo ID, get your tickets at the station. As of this writing, cost for two people is US\$68 round trip.

Saturday, November 11: Amtrak Cascades Train #510 departs Mt. Vernon (MVN) at 9:26 a.m. (Paul and I will get on the train in Bellingham at 9:57 a.m. Please save us two seats! I'll have trip packets to give to you then.) After clearing customs at the train station, we'll walk a short distance from the Vancouver train station and take public transportation to near our hotels, either check in or at least leave our luggage for safekeeping. We'll be ready for lunch by then.

Saturday activities: Using public transportation,

- 1. go to Granville Island's shops and galleries, enjoy the cute False Creek ferries. Day pass good for all stops can be purchased on the ferries: Adult CA\$16, or Senior over 65 CA\$12. More at: http://www.granvilleislandferries.bc.ca.
- 2. stay downtown for exhibits such as:
 - . Vancouver Art Gallery, 750 Hornby Street has a special exhibit "Emily Carr: Into the Forest" 45 British Columbia paintings in the unique style of this Canadian favorite artist. The museum opens at 10 a.m. if you choose to go Sunday. Website: www.vanartgallery.bc.ca. Admission: Adult CA\$24, Senior 65+ CA\$20.
 - . Vancouver Maritime Museum's "The Lost Fleet" exhibit at 1905 Ogden Avenue at Chestnut and Cypress Streets near the Space Center. The exhibit investigates the unjust 1941 seizure of 1,200 Japanese-Canadian fishing vessels following the bombing of Pearl Harbor through photographs, models, tools and documents. Admission approx.. CA\$10. Website: www.vancouvermaritimemuseum.com.
- 3. Sadly, the harbor cruises end in September/October. Perhaps a day trip in 2018?

Saturday dinner will be at 6:30 p.m. at Joe Fortes Seafood & Chop House, which we enjoyed on our 2015 train trip. Joe Fortes' is located at 777 Thurlow Street near Alberni and Robson Streets. Eat as much or as little as you wish. Website: www.joefortes.ca.

Sunday, November 12: Breakfast on your own. We'll check out of our hotel by Noon. Free time to explore on your own until it is time to meet at the train station. Take public transportation to the train station.

Amtrak Cascades Train #517 leaves Vancouver at 5:35 p.m. and arrives in Mt. Vernon at 8:07 p.m. Be at the station <u>Vancouver Pacific Central</u>, <u>1150 Station Street by 5 p.m</u>!

HOTELS: Not cheap in Vancouver. Remember our exchange rate advantage. I did several searches and the best I found for my criteria of best comparison rate, reasonable access from train station and public transportation (Sky train preferred), safe downtown neighborhood, safe walk back from restaurant Saturday night, decent amenities, and cancellation policy, was through AAA website (Priceline administered): Paul and I will be staying in a "king studio" at L'Hermitage Hotel, 788 Richards Street, direct website: www.lhermitagevancouver.com. You, of course, are free to choose your own hotel; we'll try to finalize coordinating plans on the train ride north.

TO DO: <u>Before NOVEMBER 5</u> -- let me know you're coming, what hotel you'll stay in, and if you'll have Saturday dinner with us. I need to make the restaurant reservation.

It'll be rainy season so pack your umbrella and rain jackets. We recommend packing lightly with a backpack or small wheeled suitcase; you may be lugging it around. Don't forget your passports! Please bring your tolerance for possible train delays.
