Coming soon: Vessel impound forms for boaters and law enforcement

Photo: A Washington Fish and Wildlife police officer learns about boating-under-the-influence vessel checks during a State Parks Boating Program training event.

In 2017, the Washington State Legislature passed a law (RCW 79A.60.045) giving law enforcement officers authority to impound a vessel when they have arrested the operator for boating under the influence or reckless operation and there is not another person available to take control of the vessel.

The State Parks Boating Program is working with the Department of Licensing to finalize the four forms to be used in the vessel impound process:

- Vessel impound authorization form
- Vessel impound hearing request
- Foreclosure notice
- Forfeited vessel disposition report

In the meantime, if you would like to see drafts of any of these forms, contact Doni Thomas at doni.thomas@parks.wa.gov.

The Fair was held Friday April 20 – Sunday, April 22, 2018. Banners, posters, signs and photos were placed in and outside the booth. Literature was offered from USPS, Washington State Parks Recreational Boating Safety Program, and National Safe Boating Campaign.

Our <u>main purpose was to create awareness</u> of USPS[®], America's Boating ClubSM and of Skagit Bay Sail and Power Squadron. So many people have never heard of our organization. <u>Secondly</u>, we aimed to get people to <u>sign up for ABC Class</u>, get vessel safety checks, and interest them in membership. The US Coast Guard-approved America's Boating Course provides you with basic boating knowledge to decide what type and size boat you need, what to do when meeting another boat in a crowded waterway, and how to recognize and handle hazards. Become a more competent boater, learn from the best, and enroll in America's Boating Course today. Many boat insurance companies will offer discounts on boating insurance to boaters who successfully complete America's Boating Course. And, this course provides a sound basis for continuing your recreational boating education.

What's Included? For both sail and power boats, ABC covers a wide range of topics:

- Types of boats and their uses,
- Boating laws, both Federal and State,
- Safety equipment, both required and recommended,

- Finding your way, and adverse conditions,
- Communications,
- Trailering, knots and lines,
- Water sports topics.

The course materials include a 174-page *Student Guide*. The course is completed in seven two-hour sessions, including the final exam session. Successful completion of the final exam allows students to apply for their Washington State Boaters Card, required for anyone born after Jan 1, 1955, and operating a vessel with a 15HP motor or greater.
