Good News – Venue for the District 16 Educational Conference

Skagit Bay is hosting the D16 Educational Conference on May 9, 2020. Today's good news is that we have reserved the Seafarers Memorial Park Building as the site of the conference. The squadron first used the building on the beach at the south end of Cap Sante Marina last June for the Boating Safety Expo, finding that the location is great and the building facilities good. I have informed the District 16 SEO of the date and location and planning continues. Sandy Johnson has taken on the job of being the Food and Beverages Coordinator and is working out the menu. Stay tuned for further announcements.

Bad News – Boat Handling Course Materials are Delayed

Now for the Bad News. The squadron originally scheduled Boat Handling, the replacement for Seamanship, for last September, using the beta-test materials and no printed book. In August, National announced that the PowerPoint slides were being revised and a printed version of the text book were forthcoming by the end of September (or so). I contacted the class registrants and rescheduled the course to start on January 7, 2020, in order to use the newest presentation materials and a printed student text. Unfortunately, I may have to postpone the course again, perhaps for February 2020. The materials are not yet available for ordering and the NEO said that he had just signed the order for printing books in mid November. The drop dead date for ordering course materials for an early January start is December 13, because of the Christmas rush and holidays. I will make the call on December 10. Stay tuned (again). On the Good News side, we have 13 students signed up for the course as of 25 Nov 2019.

<u>Place (where the Olympic Caldron is located)</u> from Nov. 20 - December 23. There are Christmas

Tree Terrace, activities, lots of food choices, and a variety of vendor artisan and merchant
booths, just like the Europeans. See all the vendors

Tickets are available on line (cheaper than at the gate, and prices in C\$): Adults 12.99, youth 6.99, age 0-6 free, seniors 65+ 10.99. I suggest for faster entry: also getting the Fast Pass Upgrade for 3.99 per person. Only service dogs are allowed, so our furry friends will need a petsitter for the day. Some food vendors will want cash only. ATMs available at the market.

Don't forget your passports, NEXUS cards. If you buy something, be sure it can cross the border back to U.S. and have receipts ready for inspection.

TRANSPORTATION: I suggest we drive in the morning, carpooling recommended, over the border to Richmond, B.C., park at the Bridgeport Station Park & Ride at 8888 River Road, (\$2.50Canadian for the day, 1512 parking spaces), and enjoy the ride via Sky Train Canada Line to the Waterfront Station downtown Vancouver, walk 8 minutes (600 meters) to the event. Sky Train for 2 zones is C\$4.25 or Concession fare (Sr. 65+, youth 14-18 with valid photo ID, children 5-13) is C\$2.95 each way. Tickets can be purchased at the station via machine. We can take the Sky Train back. Maps will be provided to participants.
