Let's start getting smart (again). The Summer Education

Doldrums are over and we need to get back to boating fundamentals. This Fall, we are teaching (by Zoom) courses about preparing for cruises – weekend or month long – and how to use that very important, but often understood piece of equipment – RADAR.

Cruising and Cruise Planning Course (CCP)

The Cruise Planning course starting on September 22 already has 11 people signed up and registration closes on September 1. Contact your boating friends and show them the flyer describing the course, found elsewhere in this issue of *The Bitter End*.

Radar for Boaters Course (RA)

The Radar for Boaters course will be held via Zoom video conferencing over six sessions, 6:30-8:30 pm, on Tuesdays and Fridays, starting on November 6, 2020, and the in-car final exam is set for December 5. The course flyer is shown elsewhere in this newsletter and you ae encouraged to pass information about this course to your boating friends.

The course text book is Kevin Monahan's 240-page The Radar Book, 2nd Edition with a 2018 Supplement on the latest technology. Topics include: how radar works, what you see on the screen, how to control and manage settings and fine tuning, connecting with other nav devices, using radar for blind navigation, as well as a review of Colregs which apply to radar.

Cost is \$150 for a non-USPS member or \$190 for two family members sharing course materials. (USPS member's costs are \$80/\$100.) Tuesdays and Fridays September 22, 25, 29, October 02, 06, 09, 13, 17, 2020 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.

There is something very special about the thrill of cruising in new waters and the sense of accomplishment upon completing an extended cruise. To go beyond what most boaters do on a weekend overnight or even a week or so marina hopping requires boaters to leave their normal cruising areas and comfort zones. The Cruising and Cruise Planning course focuses on the planning and preparation necessary for safe enjoyable extended cruises on both inland and coastal waters. Students receive a 240 page textbook for reading, answer quizzes, and complete a final exam. Designed for boaters who cruise on either a sail or powerboat (owned or chartered)—this course covers the following topics:

- Cruise preparation and planning General
- Boat and Equipment
- Anchors and Anchoring
- Security
- Chartering
- Cruising Outside the United States
- Crew and Provisioning
- Voyage Management
- Communications
- Navigation
- Weather
- Emergencies

Tuesdays and Fridays November 06, 10, 13, 17, 20, 24, December 05, 2020

The course covers the different types of radar equipment, their capabilities and limitations, as well as their features and how they apply to students' needs. It covers what you need to know about radar, from how and where to mount the antenna to how to interpret the displays, so you can use your radar for collision avoidance and for navigational purposes.

What's Included? For both sail and power boats, Radar for Boaters covers a wide range of topics:

- How radar works basic concepts,
- What you see on the screen,
- How to control and manage settings,
- Fine tuning of detailed settings,
- Connecting to other nav devices,
- Using radar for blind navigation,
- Review of error conditions and heavy weather,
- Review of Colregs as they apply to radar use.
