

Hello Boating Friends. I want to encourage you to invite a nonmember to our General Meeting dinner on June 10 at the Farmhouse.

We have a guest speaker from the Anacortes Waterfront Alliance, a non-profit organization that is committed to serving the waterfront needs of the Anacortes public.

Talk to your friends and family about getting their Washington State Boater Education Card through our ABC class offered in the September 2021 time frame. This card must be in a boater's possession when operating a power boat with a motor of 15 horsepower or greater. Watch for details on the upcoming course.

Based on a joint agreement between U.S. and Canada, the border is now closed until June 21. The U.S. is pushing for a plan on re-opening after June 30, but Canada is remaining steadfast with no plan. I have heard that large amounts of the vaccine are headed in their direction in June and July, so there may be a plan soon.

All Vessel Examiners are required to complete the 2021 workshop prior to July 13, 2021. If you are interested in this opportunity you can information at: https://americasboatingclub.org/
