### DAVID B

I am one who cheers when a classic motor vessel is saved from the dump heap. One stellar example is the 1929 "David B" which is berthed at Bellingham's Squalicum Harbor when not touring in Alaska.

Paul and I joined others for a special tour of this beauty April 13 before it departs for its 19th season in Alaska. This is a loving restored and maintained by Jeffrey and Christine Smith and their adventure cruising Northwest Navigation Company. Everything is in Bristol shape. She has a delightful-but-I'm-glad-I-don't-have-to-use Heartland Sweetheart wood-burning stove for cooking. The dining area has wrap-around windows. There are 4 staterooms for up to 8 people below deck along with the engine room and storage and captain's quarters. The head includes a cast-iron bathtub with shower. The boat is powered by the original Washington Iron Works three-cylinder diesel engine, the oldest one still in use on a boat. The David B was built at the Lake Washington Shipyard in Houghton, WA, worked in Bristol Bay, Alaska and at a cannery in Ekuk on the Nushugak River for about 25 seasons. It also towed smaller boats to the salmon fishing waters. The "David B" got stuck on the beach when the Nushugak River changed course. It sat for decades until then owners brought her by barge to Seattle where, in 1998, Northwest Navigation became the new owners. A major restoration and update with great attention to detail was done; even the keyboard at the helm has brass-encased keys. It is 65' long, has a 16' beam, displaces 67 tons and the draft is 7'. Her frame is steam-bent oak and laminated fir/epoxy. The planking is douglas fir.
